Good luck to all of our students competing in Winter Sports, great to hear on Mondays how proud they are of themselves for being part of a team.

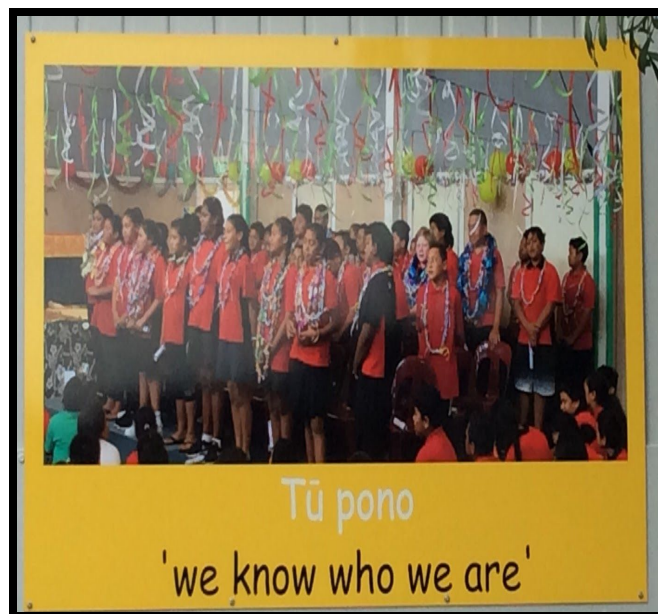
